SETUP INSTRUCTIONS

STEP 1

Lay the shelter on the ground. Do not force shelter when un-folding.

NOTE:

In windy conditions anchor one corner with provided ice anchors.

This will assist when setting up in windy conditions.

STEP 2

Grasp the webbing loop sewn onto the eyelet located in the center of the roof panel and pull outward until the top section pops open.

STEP 3

Grasp the webbing loop sewn onto the eyelet located in the center of one of the panels and pull outward so that the wall pops open.

STEP 4

Proceed by walking around the entire shelter pulling on each wall webbing loop to pop out each wall until all the sides are popped out.

STEP 5

Your shelter should be constructed completely. You may now proceed by anchoring the shelter to the ice using the provided ice anchors and guylines.

TEAR DOWN INSTRUCTIONS

STEP 1

Remove all guylines and ice anchors and store them in the provided pouch.

STEP 2

Push the center hub on any panels until it collapses inward.

STEP 3

Continue pushing each panel inward until all the walls are collapsed.

STEP 4

Push the hub of the roof inward until it collapses.

STEP 5

Gather the corners of the shelter and fold together.

STEP 6

Place folded shelter back into the carrying case with the hubs towards the bottom end of the bag.

USE AND CARE INSTRUCTIONS

- In windy conditions you should stake down at least one bottom corner before beginning setup.
- Be sure to stake down your shelter to keep it securely in place.
- Remove stakes before proceeding with take down.
- To prolong the life of the shelter DO NOT leave outdoors for extended periods of time as prolonged exposure to sunlight may cause the fabric to fade.
- To stop any leakage, use seam sealer on all seams and premium waterproofing/UV protecting spray on all sidewalls and seams. To extend the life of the blind, this may need to be done periodically.
- To prevent mildew, allow the blind to dry thoroughly before storing.
- Always store in a cool, dry place.
